


Should I send my child to school?



My child has a high temperature. More than 37.8 degrees, twice in a 4 hour period.

My child has lost sense of taste or smell.

My child has a new, persistent cough, (described as a 'difficult' cough) that you have monitored over the period of an hour.

Someone in my household has any of these symptoms stated.

Please do not send your child to school. Please arrange for the household member with symptoms to have a Covid test. Please only send your child back to school once you receive a negative result or 14 days have passed from the first day of the symptoms.

Please do not send your child to school. Please arrange for your child to have a Covid test. Everyone else in the household must also self-isolate. Please only send your child back to school once you receive a negative result or 10 days have passed from the first day of the symptoms.

My child has a cold, but has no temperature.

My child has a cold, but does not have a new, persistent cough.

My child has a cold with a cough, but the cough is clearly a 'clearing cough' related to the cold and not persistent.

My child has a runny nose or sore throat, but does not have a high temperature.

Yes, please send your child to school. Maybe dose them up with some paracetamol or ibuprofen to make them feel a bit better.

If your child displays any of the above symptoms whilst in school, you will be asked to collect your child. You will then need to request a test and self-isolate according to the Public Health England guidelines.
