Children in Year 1 and 2 should now be bringing home Phonic Readers. Please bear with us as the level of book your child is reading might take a few weeks to adjust. Please remember your child should be able to read with 90-95% accuracy so they can understand what they are reading.

Children in Reception will bring home a reading folder with a book, reading record and other information to support reading at home by the end of this week.

Could you be a Mystery Reader?

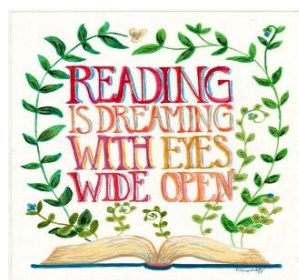


We would like to ask for volunteers to be virtual Mystery Readers.

We are planning to build up our library to include non-fiction books. The children thoroughly enjoy finding out facts and it will be a fantastic resource for supporting the children's learning in class.

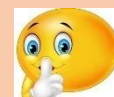
If you have any good quality non-fiction books you no longer read at home, we would greatly appreciate it if you could send them in to school.
