Some of the benefits of bedtime stories are:

- It is good bonding time
- It improves reading skills as you act as a role model
- It sparks and cultivates imagination which will filter into writing
- It encourages engagement, attention and creates conversation
- It encourages a love of reading
- It expands your child's vocabulary and enriches their language development
- It improves emotional intelligence and gives children an outlet for empathy
- It encourages independent reading
- It improves mental wellbeing
- It helps you both relax and unwind


