


The Summer Slide!



The **summer slide** is a **decline in reading ability** that can occur over the summer months when children are not at school.


Younger children are prone to the most learning loss, as it follows a curve where it's accelerated early on and then levels out as children get older. Decoding, letter knowledge, and word reading skills are very susceptible to decline without frequent practice.

Reading or taking part in reading-related activities for a little time every day will help your child to maintain the reading skills they have worked so hard to achieve throughout the year. To encourage this, every child will bring home a Summer Reading Diary to complete and return to school in September. There are some ideas in the front but the main messages are let your child read what they enjoy, keep reading to your child and keep playing games to recall the sounds.









Library Summer Reading Challenge

To help with the above, don't forget to sign your child up for the library Summer Reading Challenge called Wild World Heroes. The children were very excited when it was launched during a special assembly by Karen from Aldershot library.


