YEAR 2

Science


Children will:

History

Children will:

- Order the events of the Great Fire of London.
- Express reasons why the fire spread.
- I'dentify the damage caused by the fire and where people could flee to.
- Discover how London has changed and been rebuilt.
- Consider how the fire service has changed.


Suggested Experiences
