Spring 2 – Can you tell me a story? The children's learning will be focused around Traditional Tales. We will explore the elements of a story, discuss characters such as heroes and villains, create our own alternate endings and write our own stories.

Know about 2D shapes and identify their properties.

Literacy

Talk about and respond to stories recalling, sequencing and anticipating key events.

Read sentences made up of taught sounds and tricky words.

Describe and explain features of their environment using related vocabulary.

Make comparisons between their lives and others.

Discuss features of their past from own experiences and begin storytelling.
