

Summer Reading Challenges!


Well done to all the children who took part in the reading challenges over the summer. Thank you to parents for supporting these. It makes such a difference to the child's development and love of reading.

Reading Books-Reception and Year 1

In Reception and Year 1, the children have access to two books:

<u>Phonic reader</u>-This book <u>is linked</u> to phonic knowledge so it supports the children's reading development. It is available as a Collins eBook at home but as a physical book in school. This book is kept for a week and should be read at least 4 times during this time.
