Topic: Next week in history, we are going to learn about Roman villas.

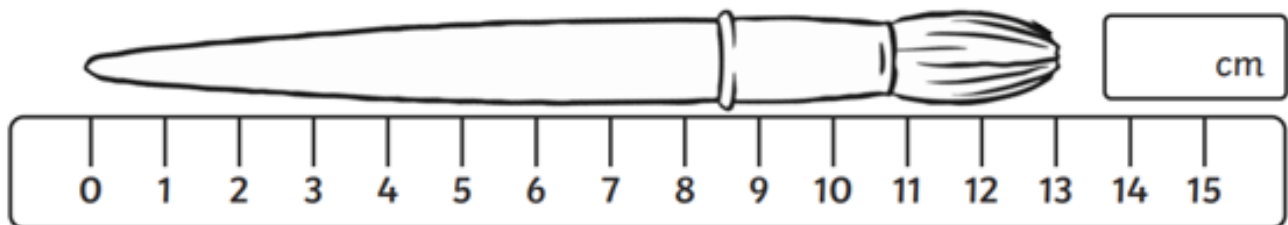
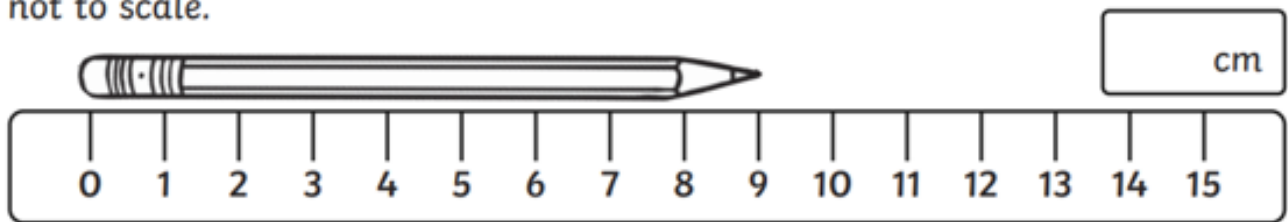
Additional Notes or Information for the week
