
What will the children be learning in Year 4 next week?

Pelé, the Brazilian men's footballer, has died. He was thought to be one of the best players of all time. He scored over 1000 goals. Pelé was part of the Brazilian men's team that won the World Cup in 1958, 1962 and 1970.

Edson Arantes de Nascimento (known as 'Pelé') was born on 23rd October 1940.

He played his first match for Santos FC when he was 15. At the age of 17, he played his first game for Brazil at the 1958 Men's

World Cup in Sweden. In the semi-final, he scored a hat-trick against France. He then scored two goals against Sweden in the final.

Success continued to follow Pelé. The Brazilian government thought he was very important to their country so they even named him a "national treasure". This was to stop him leaving Brazil and playing for football teams in Europe.

People remembered Pelé after he stopped playing football. In 1999, the International Olympic Committee named him their Athlete of the Century. In the same year, Pelé was the joint winner of FIFA's Footballer of the Century with Diego Maradona.
